Sittercity provides UC employees with access to local, pre-screened caregivers and the tools (including reviews, references and back ground checks) to review and select the caregiver of their choice. While Sittercity employs many pre-screening and on-going monitoring processes, and will provide support to UC employees if there are concerns, UC employees are responsible for their use of Sittercity, including selecting, hiring, paying and managing the caregivers of their choice.
